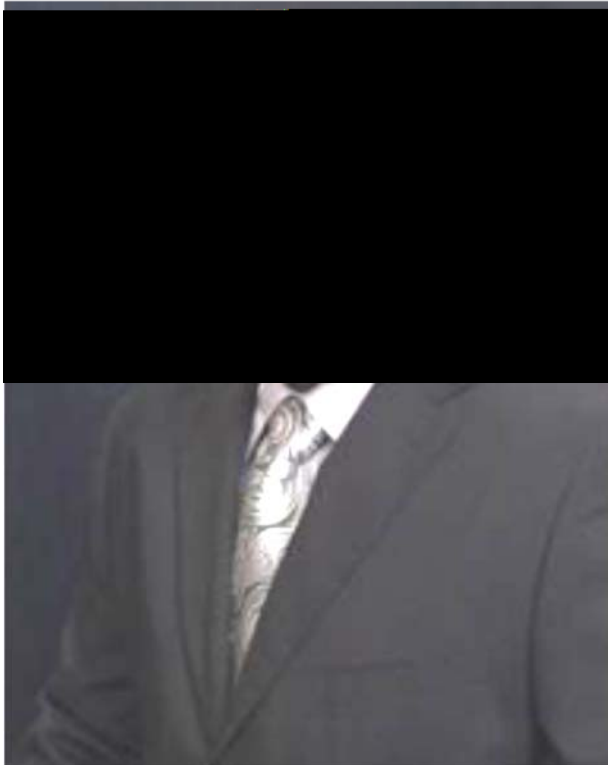


Health Disparities in the United States: Opportunities and Challenges

Roland Thorpe, PhD, is Associate Professor at Johns Hopkins University, Bloomberg School of Public Health, Director of the Program for Research on Men's Health, and Deputy Director at the Johns Hopkins Center for Health Disparities Solutions. He was appointed to the National Committee on Vital and Health Statistics at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Dr. Thorpe's research has focused on racial and socioeconomic health disparities, particularly those experienced by Black men in the U.S. He serves as the principal investigator on several extramurally funded grants, including those awarded by the National Institutes of Health. Among his projects are: the Black Men's Health Survey; Stress and Mortality among Black Men Study; and Stress and Longevity among African American Families Study. He is Editor-in-Chief of Ethnicity & Disease. He has mentored several under-represented minorities at various career stages.
